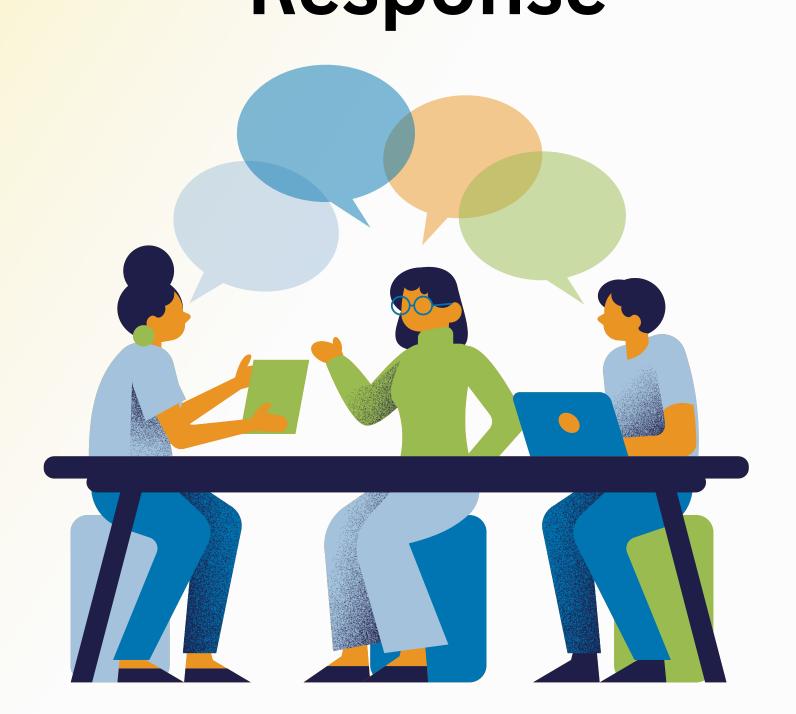

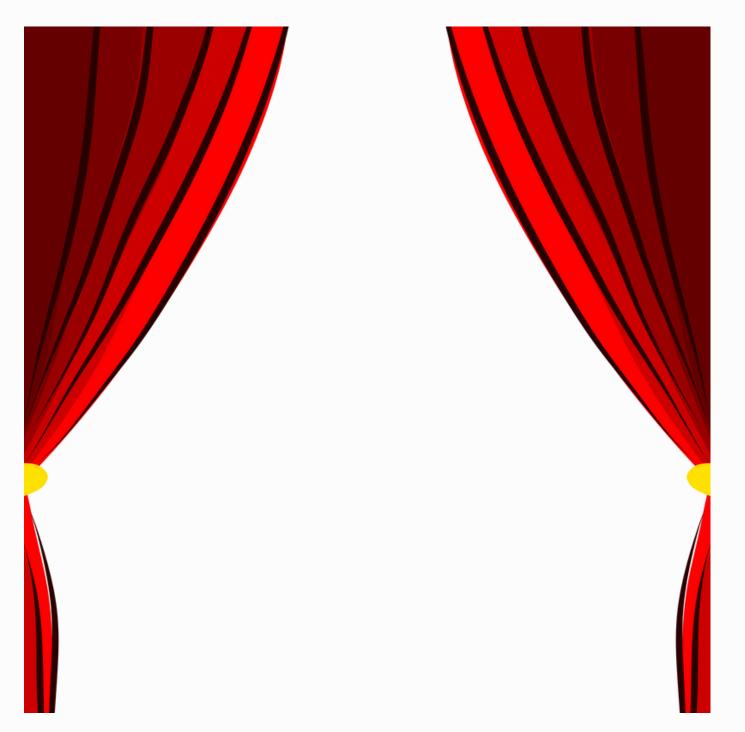

Solution 2: Coordinated Operational Leaders Response



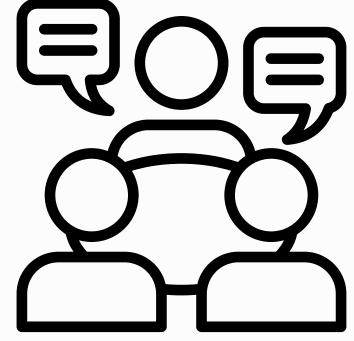

Description

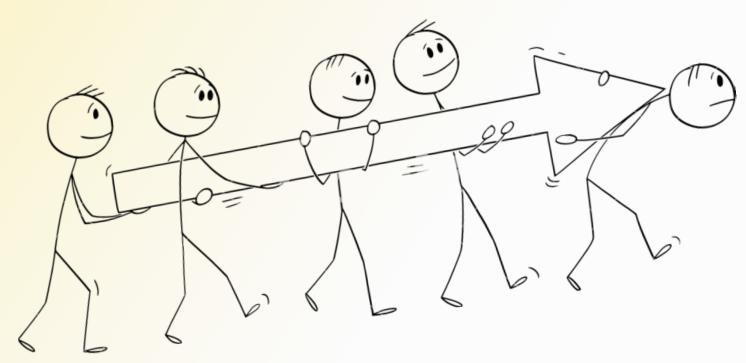
An immediate, Ad hoc committee meeting

departments, professions (doctors, nurses), and
ancillary workers (housekeeping, security), and
Person with Lived and Living experience (PWLLE) or
Peer representation.







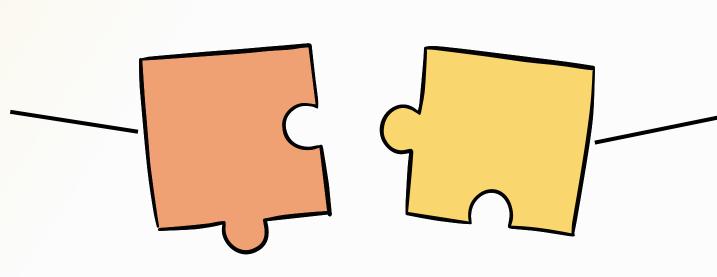
Rationale & Strengths



- roots in **Crisis Resource Management (CRM)**, aviation in the 1980s/anesthesia 1990s (Savoldelli, et. al, 2019).
- CRM skills: problem solving, situational awareness, resource utilization, communication, and leadership (Lucus)
- CRM often Simulation-Based training (SBT)
 (Petrosoniak), involves development, refinement, and challenging, of shared mental models
- Actors within the system have critical knowledge, to manage the emergent issue (Zeitz, et. al, 2022).

Implementation & Challenges

Immediate, Ad hoc committee meetings broad representation (non-siloed)



Regular structured communication "key messages" disseminated to staff

Feedback channel for staff concerns (emergent issues) brought to attn. of decision-makers

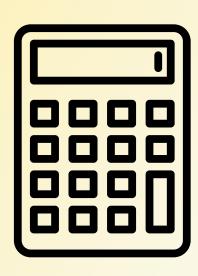

Burnout Stigma Time Silos No CRIMINS

Feasibility



- Limited budget requirement no staff hiring, major budget, or capital expenditures, other than limited additional time, allocated from current operational leader role.
- Honorarium/fee, payment for PWLLE/Peers could receive rapid approval
- Requires responsive leadership in early phases to establish structure.
- Ongoing CRM, Simulation-Based training (SBT) would require prioritization & financial investment.

Recommendations

"During a crisis or critical situation, things are often chaotic, unpredictable, ill-defined, rapidly changing, high stakes, and therefore stressful." (Savoldelli, 2019)

- Ground-level agile leadership is key to clarify direction and organize a consistent response (in this case in adapting provincial Decriminalization policy to the local context of Interior health)
- Literature from Crisis Response Management (CRM) and the Covid-19 Pandemic helped to inform the modification to the existing solution.
- Integration of Subject-Matter Experts (SMEs) and ideally PWLLE/Peers into these teams is essential, to combat Stigma, and promote best-practices.
- Challenges in implementation such as silos, could be addressed with ongoing CRM Simulation-based Training for frontline leaders.
