Context of the Problem

BC's fertility rate – lowest ever recorded (BC Stats, 2023) 22,376

Residents Without PCP

Almost 20% of Kamloops lacks family doctor access

Canadians experiencing fertility challenges nationally (Whitehead, 2024)

Cite Geography as Barrier

Thompson-Okanagan respondents didn't pursue IVF due to cost and geography (Quelch, 2025)

Without a family doctor, many can't get the referral needed to start IVF. Rural women travel hours for care.



Why Education Matters



Clear, timely, region-specific information helps navigate wait-times and funding

A centralized, transparent system can help address patient frustration (Jones et al., 2022)

Critical Context: BC's public IVF program launched in 2025 but clinics hit capacity within weeks (Global News, 2025)

The Reality Gap

Most patients over-estimated success rates and felt unprepared for costs and travel (McMahon, 2024; Greco, 2025)

- Realistic expectations









Content accuracy	Quarterly reviews with clinical partners
Clinic capacity	Transparent wait-time information
Language barriers	Multi-language translations and cultural adaptation
Awareness reach	Multiple platform distribution strategy

Public Awareness Drives Policy Change

1 — Ontario Expansion

Public pressure over two-year waitlists led to **\$1.5 million funding expansion** (Delaurier, 2025). Rural stories amplified - call for regional solutions (Grecco, 2025)

2 — Americans Plan to Slash IVF Costs

Trade deal to decrease cost of IVF by 42-79% (Casiano, 2025) AmericansforIVF.org

3 — National Strategy Call

Fertility Matters Canada (2024) advocated for national awareness campaigns and increase in access and support for fertility care

4 Calls for Legal Right to Paid leave for IVF

63% of employees undergoing IVF are taking sick leave to undergo treatment (Roberts, 2025)

Our initiative amplifies Kamloops voices to build support for future provincial and national policy expansion.

B.C. faces calls to expand first-ever publicly-funded IVF program

The program was announced last year, and will pay up to \$19,000 for one round of IVF for patients covered under B.C.'s Medical Services Plan.
